
What is SOS-Student Outreach Services?

Student Outreach Services (SOS) is a dedicated team of multidisciplinary staff members offering alternative interventions and support for students experiencing difficulties in their school environment. These Difficulties may include problems with academics, health, attendance, behavior or personal and family issues. A few examples of things SOS might address are students who are facing significant illness or disability, students who are having difficulty with academics, students who have sudden changes in behavior, students who have sporadic attendance in school, and students who may be suffering from their own substance use or that of a family member. If you are concerned about yourself or someone else, SOS may be of assistance.

Who is on the SOS Team?

The SOS Core Team is composed of members that include teachers, health aide, administrators, mental health worker, interns, school psychologist and counselors. The Team recognizes our school as a community and strives to include all staff and parents/guardians who can help a student in need. The team is committed to a solution-oriented approach.



Who can make a referral and how are they made?

Anyone can make a referral. A person can refer him/herself. Referral forms can be obtained from the counseling office secretary.

All referrals are confidential.

What happens when someone is referred?

Once a referral is submitted, information is compiled from as many sources as possible in order to get a comprehensive student profile. An Action Plan is developed by the team and a case manager is assigned to see that specific interventions are implemented. A wide-range of interventions may include school-based strategies as well as referrals to community-based resources.
